

As a result of the events of September 11, 2001, the Department of Homeland Security was established to provide uniformity in preparation to disaster response, countrywide. In 2003, the State of Colorado was divided into 9 All Hazard Regions to be able to better coordinate disaster responses ranging from wildfire and flood response to terrorist attacks. These regions have their own Director under the management of the Colorado Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHSEM). In the event of a declared State of Emergency resulting from a spreading pandemic, each Region's DHSEM will assist the County Office of Emergency Management (OEM), feed information back to the State and County Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs) and all County Health Departments and Sheriff and Fire resources to coordinate a response. These departments are also the conduit for disaster funding from the Federal Government.

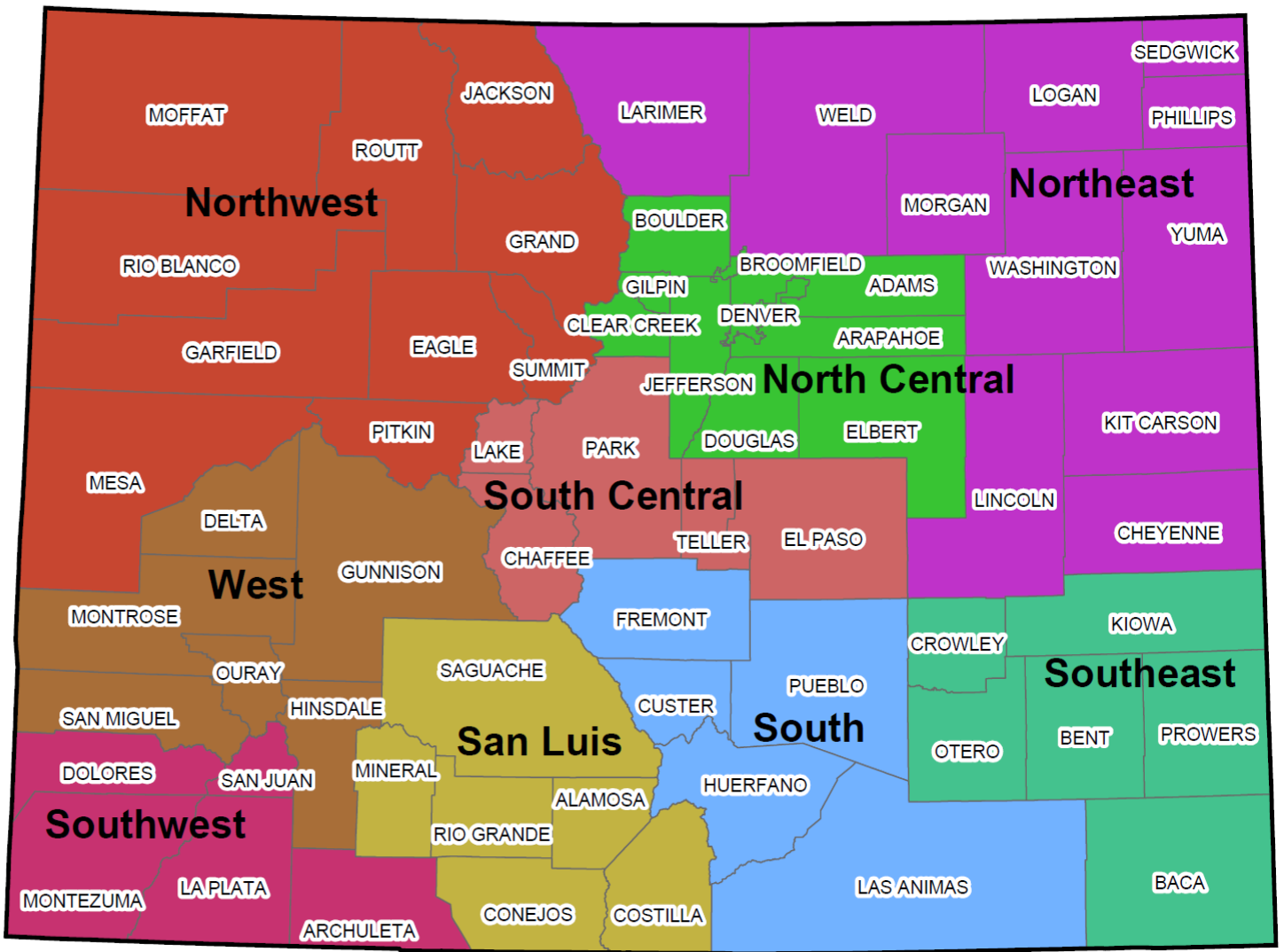
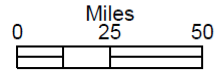
Colorado All Hazards Emergency Management Regions

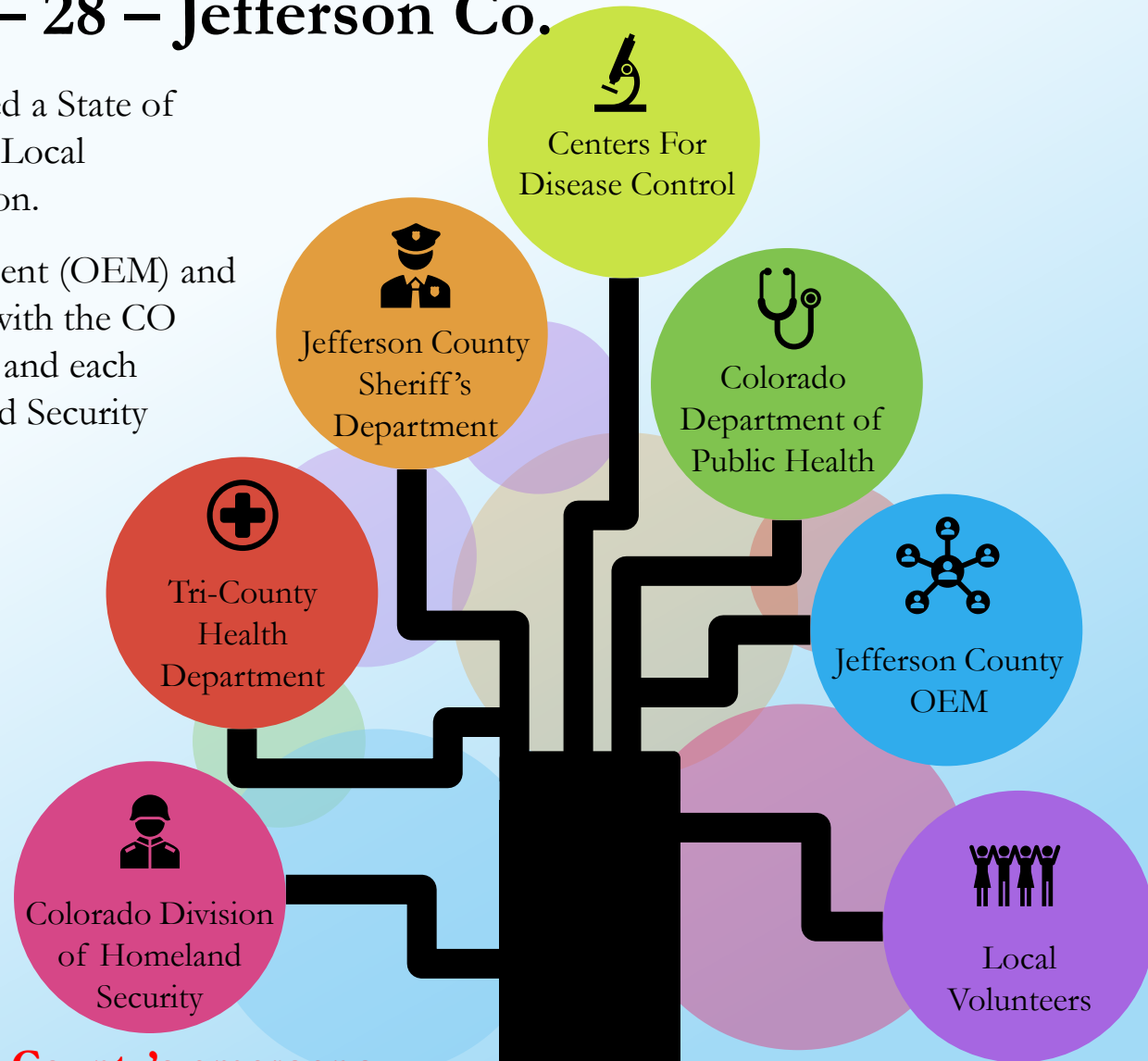
